## This week's standard:

• Students use biographies and stories to understand the individuals who are honored by the nation. (Social Studies: History)

## **Activities:**

- 1. Write the letters G-E-O-R-G-E down the left side of a piece of paper. Find newspaper words that start with those letters and describe George Washington. Paste your words next to the correct letters.
- 2. What special skills and knowledge did George Washington demonstrate in his life? Divide a piece of paper into three columns. Label the columns *Planter/Farmer, Military Leader* and *President*. List the skills and knowledge George Washington demonstrated in each of the three columns.
- 3. How were these events important in George Washington's life: (a) the Constitutional Convention, (b) French and Indian Wars, (c) life at Mt. Vernon and (d) surveying?
- 4. What would George Washington's social media account look like? Create an account for Washington, like Facebook or Twitter. Write a brief biography for the account. Write three posts that Washington might have put on his account that talked about his life or experiences.
- 5. Use the Internet or books to learn more about Washington's beliefs about his job as the first president. Then write a paragraph explaining why Washington was our <u>first</u> president.
