Standards Spotlight: Women in the Lead

- 4. What are some unusual facts about (a) Nancy Pelosi, (b) Jeannette Rankin, (c) Margaret Chase Smith and (d) the U.S. House of Representatives?
- 5. What is public service? Why do you think people want to go into public service? Write a paragraph discussing what public service means to you.
